Clery Geography

Statistics must be reported for three locations:

- On-campus (includes on-campus student housing as a subset)
- Public property within or immediately adjacent to campus
- Noncampus buildings or property

Campus Security Authority (CSA)

CSAs are individuals or organizations that must report any Clery-reportable crime that comes to their attention so the institution can compile accurate statistics.

The four categories are:

- 1) A campus police department or campus security department of the institution.
- 2) Any individual responsible for campus security but who is not part of a formal campus police or security department (e.g., staff who monitor entrances).
- 3) Any individual or organization named in the institution's campus security policy as someone to whom students and employees should report crimes.
- 4) An official with significant responsibility for student and campus activities (including student housing, discipline, and judicial proceedings). *Pastoral and professional counselors are exempt when acting in their counseling roles.*
